



Another Milestone for The Windsor-Essex Parkway

McGuinty Government Pleased with Federal Approval of DRIC Study

NEWS December 3, 2009

Ontario today welcomed Canada's approval of the Detroit River International Crossing (DRIC) Environmental Assessment under the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act.

Ontario will continue to make significant progress on this major infrastructure initiative, including:

- starting preliminary work (initial construction) including a noise barrier and bridges in south Windsor
- furthering the process to identify a team to design, build, finance and maintain the Parkway by issuing the request for proposals (RFP) document to short-listed teams
- acquiring remaining necessary property
- implementing environmental mitigation strategies
- working with Canada, the U.S. and Michigan on the coordinated implementation of the new end-to-end border transportation system.

QUICK FACTS

- The Windsor-Essex Parkway will be owned by the Ontario government and jointly funded by Canada and Ontario. It will be designed, built, financed and maintained by a private sector partner.
- Approval under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act was received in August, 2009.
- The new border transportation system will provide freeway to freeway access from Ontario's Highway 401, by way of The Windsor-Essex Parkway, to the interstate system in Michigan. The plan includes new Canada and U.S inspection plazas and a new, six-lane bridge.
