## DRIC Study to make Draft Environmental Impact Statement available for public review and comment

WHAT:

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is seeking public comment on the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS)/Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation for the Detroit River International Crossing (DRIC) Study. Public hearings will be conducted in Detroit in March to present a summary of the DEIS and provide an opportunity for all to hear comments and questions.

A review copy of the DEIS will be available at various locations in the metro Detroit area and Lansing. Comments must be e-mailed, faxed or postmarked on or before April 29, 2008. MDOT and Federal Highway Administration staff will respond to all comments received.

## **BACKGROUND:**

The Detroit River International Crossing (DRIC) Study is a bi-national effort to complete the environmental study processes for the United States, Michigan, Canada and Ontario governments related to a new crossing. The DRIC Study identifies solutions that support regional, state, provincial and national economies, while addressing the civil and national defense and homeland security needs of the busiest trade corridor in North America.

The DEIS examines the social, environmental and economic factors related to ten alternatives (nine "build" alternatives and one "no-build" alternative) that would include a new border crossing (bridge) over the Detroit River, new customs and border protection facilities on both sides of the border, and direct connections to the freeway network in both the United States and Canada.
