Detroit GreenWorks Solutions receives federal funding from the \$150 million "Pathways Out of Poverty" program authorized by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Detroit GreenWorks Solutions will receive \$4 million over 2 years to train and secure employment for individuals living in specified Detroit area zip codes.

### **Project Description:**

Pathways Out of Poverty will provide three training programs including weatherization/ deconstruction, landscaping/forestry, and urban agriculture. Each training is designed to prepare for a specific career focus such as weatherization workers, laborers and helpers in the construction industry, responsible waste management, horticulture, landscaping, and urban farming. The partners will also develop Green Living Technologies' training and apprenticeship programs.

## **Training Descriptions**

#### Landscape Industry Certification

Softscape Instillation, Hardscape Instillation, Turf Maintenance, Ornamental Maintenance, Irrigation

#### **Certified Green Industry Program**

Nurseryman, Landscape Design, Landscape Contractor, Landscape Manager, Garden Retail, Irrigation Specialist

#### **Certified Landscape Horticulture/Arborist**

One year Landscape Horticulture Certificate with specialty in Arboriculture (option)

#### **Organic Gardener**

Oversee the soil sampling, prepping of soil dropping and spreading, planting and maintaining of gardens as well as training others for future employment in other green collar jobs such as Edible Wall Technicians

#### Weatherization/Deconstruction

12 week program that is a combination of classroom learning and hands-on practice that prepares students to become weatherization specialists and deconstruction workers. In addition to the classroom and lab training, there are two weeks of field experience deconstructing a house. This course is taught by professionals and instructors from both the WARM Training Center and Henry Ford Community College.

#### Weatherization Specialist

Ten-week training program. Through classroom learning and hands-on practice, this course teaches advanced weatherization and energy concepts, preparing students as weatherization specialists and introducing them to green careers requiring higher education. Students will earn CEUs from Henry Ford Community College. This course is taught by professionals and instructors from both the WARM Training Center and Henry Ford Community College.
